



PLANET – 3rd General Assembly Meeting

17-18 May 2022, Hybrid

PLANET's third General Assembly (GA) took place in the month 24 of the project and was attended by over 60 participants. This meeting was divided in two days and followed a hybrid format. Fundación Valenciaport, leader of WP5, hosted the event, making possible the first face-to-face meeting of the project.



This technical meeting shared and advanced the technical developments that the project is implementing, resulting in an interactive meeting with representation from all project partners.

During the first day, each Living Labs Use Case and its objectives were explained in depth, exploring how PLANET's IT solutions and services can realise realistic business benefits in practice, focusing on cost reduction, on-time delivery and more efficient asset utilisation. A consolidated view of PLANET's EGTN platform architecture was presented in the second part of the day, along with how EGTN services interact with each other to maximise the value generated.

The second day addressed the resilience and responsiveness of EGTN to changes along with the impact of the war in Ukraine on TEN-T freight flows. The discussion also included the new Connectivity Index of European ports due to war implications, as well as the extension/validation of the EGTN resilience and operation together with suggestions for new nodal entry points and investments in infrastructure and technology to be integrated in EGTN for the 2030- and 2050-time horizons. Finally, on this second day, several sessions were held with the owners of the Key Exploitable Results (KERs) of the project, in order to create the basis for a few Business Models or Value Proposition Scenarios.
